



The goal of the Kentucky Comprehensive Literacy (KyCL) Grant is to close literacy gaps for all students but especially among underserved students by providing targeted support for low-income, high-need learners from birth through grade 12.

The grant open to all public districts and is split into three bands: early childhood (birth to age 5); elementary; and middle/high school.

KyCL Goals

- 1. Provide funding for needed **literacy assessments** Early Oral Language Screener, a KDE-approved Universal Screener, Literacy Diagnostic Assessments, and progress monitoring tools.
- 2. Improve reading instruction by providing Curriculum-based Professional Learning (CBPL) to all reading instructional staff that is sustained, aligned to the HQIR, and job-embedded for the effective implementation of the HQIR.
- 3. Provide equitable access to Tier 1 reading High-quality Instructional Resources (HQIR) for all K-12 students based on the Science of Reading.
- 4. Provide writing HQIRs, targeted literacy interventions aligned with structured literacy, the Science of Reading training for all levels, and support for family engagement.

Required (Level 1) Activities

- Universal screener, diagnostic assessments, and Kentucky Summative Assessment reading data to evaluate progress
- HQIR for ELA (Gr. 6-12)
- Vendor-provided CBPL to support implementation of the HQIR (2- to 4-year plan required) along with coaching
- If needed, evidence-based, high-quality, comprehensive reading program including supplemental curriculum for foundational reading (K-5)

Optional (Level 2) Activities

- KDE-approved universal screeners and reading diagnostic assessments and associated PD, if needed
- **Instructional resource support and PD** for tiered instruction following the KY MTSS framework
- High-quality PD on the Science of Reading
- High-quality, explicit, and systematic writing HQIRs and associated PD
- Literacy training and family engagement activities
- Effective transitions from elementary-middle-high school
